



## Dispensational Perspectives on Israel: A Friendly Critique.

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### 1. Defining Dispensationalism.




Dispensation: A dispensation is a distinct period of time – distinct because during that period of time God governs men in a certain way. One dispensation ends and a new one begins when God changes the way He governs men.



Dispensationalist: A Christian who believes in the <u>basic</u> distinctives of the prophetic systems of J.N.Darby and C.I.Scofield.



## THE FIVE POINTS OF DISPENSATIONALISM...



1. God has two distinct programs in history, one for Israel, and one for the Church.



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- Ephesians 2:1-11 Israel & the Church are now the ONE people of God.

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- Ephesians 2:1-11 Israel & the Church are now the ONE people of God.
- Galatians 3:7-9 Church partakes of the promises of Abraham





"The Church is not fulfilling in any sense the promises of Israel" – Charles Ryrie

- Example: Land Promise (Gen 13:14-15) & 'forever.'



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- Problem: Levitical priesthood forever? (1 Chron 15:2)
- ALL promises fulfilled in Christ (Gal 3:16; 2 Cor 1:20)
- Original fulfillment (Josh 21:43; Neh 9:8)
- Ultimate fulfillment in Christ (Rom 4:13)



### 3. The Church age is a mystery, and thus no Old Testament prophecies foresaw it.

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- Isaiah 19:23-25; Zac 9:6-7
- Gen 12:2-3; Gal 3:29 promise to bring in the Gentiles



4. The present Church age is a parenthesis during which God has temporarily suspended His primary purpose with Israel.

Pentecost: "The Church is manifestly an interruption for God's program for Israel" – J. Dwight Pentecost



5. The Church, or Body of Christ, therefore does not include Old Testament believers.

"Nevertheless, dispensationalism insists that the people of God who have been baptized into the Body of Christ and thus form the Church, are distinct from saints of other days or even of a future time." – Charles C Ryrie
